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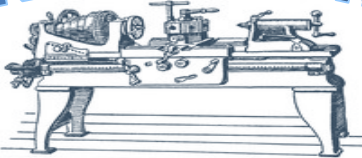

What is SWAT? The SouthWest Association of Turners!

The SWAT organization exists to promote the craft of woodturning through training, demonstrations, hands on experience and exhibits. SWAT offers something for all levels of experience from hobbyists to professionals. Each year, in August, SWAT offers their 3-day symposium. If you enjoy woodturning and want to meet like-minded folks, this is the place for you. All ages and levels of experience are encouraged to attend and broaden their craft and/or learn new skills.

In addition to learning from the demonstrations at SWAT, you can also learn from rubbing elbows with a wide range of experienced turners. The years of experience found at each SWAT event runs into the thousands, and there's not a nicer group of people who are willing to share their experience.

This year, the 7 Lead Demonstrators are: John Beaver, Trent Bosch, Andy Chen, Jason Clark, Rebecca DeGroot, Mike Jackofsky, Colwin Way. We encourage you to look at the SWAT website, read their bios and see what they will be demonstrating. And also, check out the line-up of the 21 Regional Demonstrators. The hard task will be to select the 10 sessions you wish to see!

What is so special about woodturning?

Woodturning is a craft - an art form for many people - where wood is cut and shaped (turned) on a lathe with a variety of hand-held tools. The various tools are used to cut the wood in different ways. What makes woodturning so interesting is that a single piece of wood can be turned into a vase, a lidded jar, a bowl, a plate, a pen, a bottle stopper, or a beautiful art piece. It all depends on the vision and imagination of the woodturner (maker). How the wood becomes something beautiful and/or useful depends on the tools used - and the skill of the maker. Woodturners continually aspire to hone and advance their craft. Incremental improvements over time produce amazing works of art.

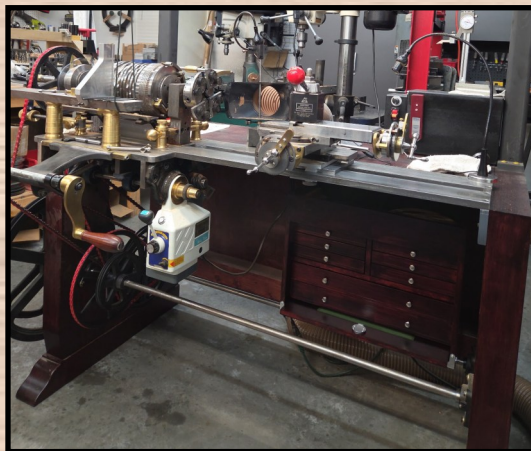

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

How can YOU help?

Below is a list of programs we partner with and a very brief description of what they do. Please look at each program on our website under the "[Community](#)" banner for more information and discover what you can do to help each one. In 2025, we donated a combined 331 items! We have cleared the numbers, but as you give, we will list the totals to the left of each organization, hopefully watching the numbers grow each month. Let's set a goal to surpass our total from last year!

- 0 BEADS OF COURAGE:** This program supports children and teens with serious illnesses by helping them tell their stories of bravery through colorful beads. Each bead represents a significant moment in their treatment journey, such as a medical procedure or personal achievement. Boxes may be delivered to Burt Andrew.
- 1 EMPTY BOWLS & RESTORED HOPE** *Empty Bowls*, organized by the North Texas Food Bank, is an annual event that raises funds to support North Texans facing hunger. The funds raised from the event provide critical support to the NTFB's programs. *Restored Hope* is a program dedicated to rescuing young women and their children trapped in sexual slavery, trafficking, and domestic violence. Wood-turned items that are donated typically bring from \$80 to \$500 each. Items for both of these organizations may be given to Alain Schwarz.
- 102 FREEDOM PEN:** {NOTE: 92 Pens were given out at the Fair!} This program started in 2004 by the Sgt Joe Kelly Freedom Pen Foundation as an all-volunteer initiative to provide custom hand-crafted pens to American servicemen and women. It is for anyone interested in donating their time, talent, and services in providing writing instruments for active-duty military personnel, as well as veterans, as a symbol of our support and care. Pens can be delivered to Bill Belitz.
- 0 OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD:** Is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. It collects and distributes shoeboxes filled with gifts to children in need around the world. The shoeboxes typically contain toys, school supplies, hygiene items, and other small gifts. It's part of a broader effort to share the gospel and to support communities in crisis. Toys may be delivered to Ron Williams.
- 5 VETERANS PENS:** Is a diversion program for Justice-Involved Veterans (JIV) who are facing prosecution for one or more criminal cases. Their mission is to provide support and rehabilitation to qualified JIV criminal defendants whose crimes were materially connected to injuries suffered as a result of honorable service in the United States Armed Forces. Completed pens can be given to Chris Cohen.
