SWAT News

I just returned from Waco and my first SWAT board meeting of the year. First off, the dates for SWAT this year are August 25, 26, & 27. The set up team will have to be there on Thursday the 24th.

The lead demonstrators this year will be; Emiliano Achaval, Cindy Drozda Colwin Way, Tom Lohman (segmenting), John Lucas, Derik Weidman (off center turning)

Among the regional demonstrators is our own Donna Frazier, Janice Levi (pyrography), Neil Brand, Jim Buckelew (segmenting), Kayla Cooper (pens) and 10 others.

The 3 for 1 Raffle will be giving away a Power Matic Lathe as well as 3 Jet 12/21s. The host hotels are the same, the Hilton attached to the convention ctr., and the Courtyard by Marriott across the street from the convention ctr. SWAT rate is \$167.00 per night. Of course, many other hotels available also. Host hotels usually go quick.

Food & Catering, The board spent a long time on this one. As you are aware if you've gone the past couple of years, the food has left a lot to be desired. This is, by far, the largest expense for SWAT costing upwards of \$65,000. They have 26 caterers in Waco to choose from this year, compared to 6 last year, no decision has been made yet. One decision was NOT to have a \$45 Banquet meal this year on Sat. night. There will be a meal, no foo foo meal, just a family style meal, possibly Mexican food or Bar BQ that will cost about \$20 per person. Not \$45. After the meal will be the Sat night Raffle drawing. No meal on Friday night. There will be lunches on Fri, Sat & Sun.

Online Registration will start on March 1st until August 1st. Basic registration will be the same as last year, \$175.00 for all 3 days.

Anyone placing items in the Gallery will be allowed to put out business cards, in a holder if they wish to sell an item. That transaction will be between the seller and the buyer, not involving SWAT.

The rooms could possibly be rearranged to make more larger rooms and eliminate the tiny rooms. This may possibly effect HCW's longtime location, not sure yet.

That is about all for now. I'll let you know more when I know.

How to Remove Paint from Wood Without Chemi-

Stripping or removing paint from any surface, be it wood, metal, or plastic is seldom an easy task. It is a difficult task because every surface or item takes paint differently, meaning that you will need to implore unique steps to remove it depending on the type of material it is on.

Both professionals and amateurs trying to remove paint from wood and other items or surfaces have had to settle for chemical-based removers or strippers. Albeit effective, these chemical-based strippers are made with toxic materials which not only makes them harmful to you but also makes it harmful to our environment at large.



The meeting was held at Wesley United Methodist Church and was also open to members through Zoom, conducted by Sully Sullivan. Dale Scruggs, Doug Balzer*, and Cynthia Balzer attended through the Zoom session.

Club members Attending in Person: Lee Craft*, Alain Schwarz*, Sully Sullivan*, Rod Brumlow*, Burt Andrew*, Tom Nehl, Gary Sanders, Sheryl Sanders, Ed Mastin.

[Voting board members for 2023 indicated *. A quorum of board members was in attendance.]

The Meeting was called to order at 6:05pm with HCW President, Lee Craft, presiding.

Items of Business

Board Meeting minutes from January 5, 2023:

Alain Schwarz made a motion to accept the minutes from the January 5, 2022, board meeting with no changes. The motion was seconded by Rod Brumlow. Motion passed.

Drawing for free 2023 membership:

Per usual practice, members who paid their dues by the end of the January meeting were qualified to enter a drawing for current year free membership.

The list consisted of 74 members. The drawing was conducted during the board meeting; Alan Baxter won the free membership.

Burt will notify Alan. This will be announced during next week's club meeting.

Tools and Equipment Coordinator

Tom Nehl has accepted this appointed position. Thanks to Tom for filling this spot.

Tom will ask George Freeman for the list of those who have volunteered to assist with transporting lathes and accessories to/from open shops and other activities.

February Club Demo and Open Shop:

The demo on February 9 will feature special tools, fixtures, and jigs brought to show by our own club members. The format will be like Show-and-Tell. Members are encouraged to participate.

Open Shop will be Saturday, Feb. 11, at Dale Scrugg's shop. (4245 Destiny Drive, Caddo Mills)

Doug Balzer will instruct at this month's Open Shop mini-class on finishing. He will present the Beall buffing system. Sully will show/teach the use of the club's camera equipment for instructional recording.

Website

John Regis has accepted the webmaster position from Alan Fields.

Burt will help coordinate the transition with John and Alan and may ask Carl Gideon for training and assistance.

Beginner School in February:

The two-day school, Sat/Sun, Feb. 25 and 26, will be held at Rod Brumlow's shop (102 Jeremy Drive, Royse City).

The cost will be \$125 total per student for the two days.

Instructors, selected by Training Coordinator Rod Brumlow, will not be paid. However, the club will reimburse expenses on request.

The class will feature the turning a basic bowl, pen, and a honey dipper as the primary spindle turning component. As an added feature, finishing of the bowl will be demonstrated.

Rod and Alain will announce and generate interest in this beginner school during the upcoming club meeting.

Quarterly Challenge (March):

Will feature any item with a turned component, made from any kind of 2X4, any kind of plywood, or a combination of the two.

The winning entry will be selected by a membership vote at the March meeting. The winner will be awarded a \$50 gift card.

Quarterly School, April:

Discussed having Matt Monaco for a demo and two days of training.

Cost would be approximately \$2000.

Cost per member, \$150.

Probable training location, Lee Craft's shop.

Rod Brumlow made a motion, and Alain Schwarz seconded, to have Matt Monaco for the April club demo, followed by member full-day training on Friday, April 14, and (if enough interest) another full day of training on Saturday, April 15. If fully utilized, Matt's cost would be approximately \$2000. Motion passed.

Open Shop, scheduled for April 15, will likely be pushed back one week.

Non-members will be invited (near the end of the sign-up period) if the classes don't fill up with HCW members.

Future Quarterly Schools discussed (tentative):

Segmenting School on July 22 and 23. Charlie Tucker may do the previous Thursday's demo and assist with the segmenting school. Dale King may also assist.

Lidded boxes on October 21 and Texturing on October 22.

The training currently committed and proposed though October will address the top four items in Rod's recent member interest survey.

VP Alain Schwarz recently asked about the possible use of a throat microphone to improve audio quality during demos.

Sully's research revealed that throat microphones are all push-to-talk and would not work in our application.

No cash bar this year.

On-line registration will extend from March 1 through August 1.

Gallery participants will be allowed to display business cards, with transactions between the buyer and seller (no involvement by SWAT).

Rooms may be re-arranged to eliminate the smaller demo rooms.

Hunt County Fair

The Hunt County Fair dates for 2023 extend from April 21 to April 30 (HCW setup on April 20); will be open on weekends from 10am to 7pm, and on weekdays from 5pm to 10pm.

Doug informed that the sign-up page on the website can be viewed but is not accepting names.

Will work with Alan and John Regis to get the sign-up's working asap.

Financial

Treasurer Alan Fields emailed several financial items to board members shortly in advance
of the board meeting. Alan informed by email that payments have been made to Hartford for the club's liability insurance, and to for one month of storage building rental (no discount for annual pmt.). With insufficient time to review the email to board members, and with Alan absent from the meeting, no 2022 closeout, 2023 budget, or audit items were discussed.
The meeting adjourned at 7:55pm.
