







One option is to later cut the finish piece into quarters, which would give you two sets of bookends that are about 5" tall, 5" long, and about 3" thick.



REFLECTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- Use heavy, dense hardwoods. Lighter, less dense woods would likely not be heavy enough for bookends.
- Wood bland needs to be at least a 10" in diameter and 4" thick.
- Creating a tenon to use in your chuck would likely be easier than using a faceplate.
 Use painter's tape to mark your piece for cutting. Tape up surfaces as appropriate for protection during the cutting process.
