


### **IMPORTANT IMFORMATION**

#### **SWAT News**

As SWAT Director, I went to Waco last Saturday for the first SWAT board meeting of the year.

Due mainly to low attendance last year, SWAT lost \$32,500. As you might guess, they cannot stand many more years like that. They're catering cost alone was over \$70,000. If you have eaten in the past months, you know how much food prices have risen. They're proposed catering cost for this year is over \$93,000. Therefore, for the first time since 2013, they are raising ticket prices. Early Registration (on line) ticket prices are going to be \$175.00. That's up from the \$140. we've been paying. Spouses will cost \$100. Banquet tickets are the same \$45.00. This is for all 3 days. a one day ticket is \$100.00. Walk up tickets (not on line) are going to be \$275.00 for 3 days, \$150.00 for one day. Early on line registration is strongly encouraged, you may have noticed it's a hundred dollars cheaper than walk up, not only for your tickets, but T shirts and handbooks. This way they will have a accurate number of how many will attend so they will know how much food is needed, how many shirts, and how many handbooks to have printed. This will help they're bottom line a great deal, which is \$218,393.00. That is what it cost to put on a good SWAT symposium. There will be no Friday night show or meal.

The lead demonstrators this year are Martin Sabin Smith, Mike Mahoney Andy Wolfe, Barry Gross, Dennis Paullis, Craig Timmerman, and Trent Bosh. The 3 for 1 Raffle features a grand prize of a Robust American Beauty Lathe, along with 3 other prizes of Laguna REVO 12/16 lathes. Artist donations for the raffle will be appreciated. As always, the host hotels are the Hilton and the Courtyard who are giving us the discounted SWAT rate of \$160 per night.

Early Registration begins March 15th, SWAT dates are Aug 26, 27, and 28.

# HCW Tips of the month!

There are lots of things made of silicone that can benefit a woodturner...

Silicone Molds are available for resin projects and are used often by those who wish to make their own pen blanks.

Silicone Glue Brushes are handy for applying wood glue to a project. After use, you can let the brush dry, and the crusty glue will just peel off for an easy cleanup.

Silicone Mats are also super handy for easy project cleanup.

However, don't get super glue on the edge of a silicone mat. If it sticks to you work bench and you pull on the silicone mat... it will tear!

He said he didn't just make useful items out of wood. He categorized each piece of wood as to what item to make, that would show off the wood's God given grain figure. He said each utilitarian item he made was "unique" in its organic features, his job was to cooperate with nature and highlight those qualities in the pieces he made.

Continuing that thought: If the function of some woodturnings is art and its use is to emit emotion... don't all woodturnings serve a purpose and use? Can't Craft production woodturnings be naturally artistic while still being utilitarian useful?

Perhaps maybe Art and Craft aren't so different after all!

(All this is not to say that bad art and poorly crafted woodturnings are anything more than dross.)



#### Hunt County Woodturners Board Meeting Minutes April 7, 2022

This meeting was conducted at Wesley United Methodist Church and was also open to members through Zoom. Sully Sullivan served as host.

**Club members Attending in Person:** Lee Craft\*, Gary Sanders\*, Burt Andrew\*, Doug Balzer\*, Joe Grimes\*, Sully Sullivan (appointed)\*, George Freeman.

Club members Attending through Zoom: John Blattman

[Voting board members for 2022 indicated \*. A quorum of board members was in attendance.]

The Meeting was called to order at 7:04pm by HCW President, Lee Craft.

### **Items of Business**

#### **President – Lee Craft**

Reported that Sully Sullivan has accepted the AV Director position, to serve as appointed until full membership approval can be obtained.

Club meeting equipment set-up process was discussed. Lee will send out an email for anyone willing to help set-up on club meeting nights, with set-up starting at 5:30pm.

Should begin consideration of who we want to nominate for SWAT scholarships (one from SWAT; one from HCW). Had discussion regarding the age of eligible participants; Lee will call SWAT for the answer.

Lee announced an Open Shop date change for May. Because the pyrography class will be held on Friday, May 13 and Saturday, May 14, the club's regular Open Shop will be pushed back one week, to Saturday, May 21. Both events will be held at Lee's shop.

Open Shop for April will be held Saturday, April 16, at Dale King's shop (1111 Highridge Drive, Wylie). Mark Ledbetter from the North Texas Veteran's Court will attend our April Open Shop to present and invite our participation in supplying a relatively small number of patriotic-themed pens to veterans. Doug suggested that Show-and-Tell be expanded to include turned items that are old, unusual, and/or the first thing a member has turned. The idea was positively received; Lee will announce during the next club meeting.

Kevin Young has accepted appointment as club photographer, replacing Ed Mastin. Thanks to Ed for his ongoing help and dedication.

#### **Vice President – Gary Sanders**

Janice Levi pyrography class in May:

Janice Levi will demonstrate during the May 12 club meeting and will teach her pyrography class on both May 13 and May 14, at Lee Craft's shop.

Gary reported that we now have 16 individuals lined up for the class, and is maintaining a listing that includes participants, day of each member's class, and equipment requirements. All participants will be expected to have, or to be supplied, an adequate woodburner unit.

Payment (\$100 per student) will be required in advance unless otherwise arranged. Payment options: Paypal, check, cash, to Treasurer Alan Fields. Lee will discuss during upcoming club meeting.

Club member Ron Howe will be demonstrating the turning of hummingbird houses during this month's meeting.

Noted the passing of former HCW member Marion McDaniels. Lee will inform the Club next week.

#### **Secretary – Burt Andrew**

Membership:

Membership currently stands at 91, after removing those who have not paid 2022 dues (as of end of March club meeting). However, an additional 8 are expected to rejoin at or near the April meeting.

#### Logo Items:

Updated order forms will be distributed during the <u>May</u> club meeting and by email during May. Completed forms and payment will be due by the end of the <u>June</u> club meeting. Apparel delivery will be made during the <u>August</u> club meeting (in time for SWAT). Note: The vendor, Wilde Advertising, will require additional time this year to allow for the current supply chain issues.

Annual HCW audit (as required in HCW bylaws, Article XV):

Audit team members: Burt Andrew, Alan Fields, Cory White

The audit report was made available to Board members for review in advance of the meeting, and is available to any other club members on request.

Scope included: validation of CD balances, comparison of 2021 EOY reported balance with bank records, random review of 6 each revenue and expense flows, review of all bank account signatories, availability of the Club's 501c3 documentation as required by IRS, status of 2021 501c3 tax return, and up-to-date status of liability insurance.

Though no significant discrepancies were found, two items were highlighted as concerns, regarding CD account signatories, and the Club's missed YE2020 IRS return (which may result in a penalty).

Joe Grimes made a motion that the Audit, as presented, be accepted and approved with the stipulation that CD signatories be adjusted to include only current Club members. The motion was seconded by Gary Sanders. Motion passed.

### Treasurer – Alan Fields (Burt Andrew reported in Alan's absence)

A printed version of our Paypal (through March 28) and checking account (through March 31) transactions were sent out by Alan to board members in advance of the meeting.

IRS Form 990N has now been submitted for YE2021. Though the filing fee has cleared through the bank, the return is pending acceptance. Questions regarding the missed YE2020 return were asked by the IRS and have been answered by Alan.

Alan will present detailed 1st quarter financial reports (actuals to budget, CD balances, etc.) next month.

#### **Training Coordinator – Joe Grimes**

Briefed results of the Beginner School:

Two-day class was held March 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>.

Had 5 enthusiastic class participants. Joe and Doug served as instructors.

A total of four projects were completed.

Joe reports that the event broke even for the club.

Members can choose their own items to show/demonstrate at the fair and will be encouraged to also turn Freedom pens from the Club's stock of pen supplies. Doug, Gary, and others will make sure adequate materials (blanks, kits, etc.) are available. Depending on existing inventory, TBD, pen blanks may be made during Dale's upcoming Open Shop.

Lee volunteered the use of his trailer for set-up and tear-down.
