Some News From BRIAN SCHRADER TRAINING COORDINATOR

Twelve of the fourteen lathes that were in my shop in April have returned to their rightful homes. *That's right 14 lathes*!! It was a Wood Turners paradise! A huge thank you to the 31 students that attended the 4 classes offered by Kirk DeHeer. Also, many volunteers contributed to making the classes run smoothly. This was largely an experimental first-time collaboration between HCW and Dallas Area Woodturners (DAW). HCW is looking ahead at the next opportunity to offer the members of HCW a memorable educational experience.

Also:

A very special Thank You to Howard Wellspring for conducting the mini-class at the April Open Shop. Howard instructed those in attendance on turning the Freedom Pens the club gives to veterans. Pen turning and finishing is one of those subjects that you need to select what works for you. Ask nine people how to turn and finish pens and you will get a dozen different answers. I had been struggling with the method I was using for CA finishes. I was disappointed to the extent that I dreaded someone asking me to make a pen. I was attempting to mimic a great pen craftsman that could sell pens for \$500 and more. His pens are absolutely immaculate. Mine, not so much. After watching Howard I realized some of the areas that were probably responsible for my frustrations. I watched Howard, I watched Mike Nish on YouTube and I have altered my CA methods. I am now getting far more successes than failures. Note to: Brian Livingston, Chuck Day and Kevin Evans, who watched me turn using my technique that Saturday... forget and unlearn everything I showed you. I got lucky with a success that day, but I have probably steered you to a path that leads to anger and anger leads to the dark side.

If you were not at the April Open Shop and want to see a successful method (1 of many) to apply CA, look for Mike Nish on YouTube.

This month, May's Open Shop, we will have a special treat with our VP, Bill Belitz, showing us how to make whistles. We will have the club lathes and blanks available. Come learn, turn and toot your own whistle!



SWAT offers something for all levels of experience from hobbyists to professionals. All levels of experience are welcome to participate in the yearly symposium each August. If you enjoy woodturning and want to meet like-minded folks, this is the place for you. All ages and levels of experience are encouraged to attend and broaden their craft and/or learn new skills.

In addition to learning from the demonstrations at SWAT, you can also learn from rubbing elbows with a wide range of experienced turners. The years of experience found at each SWAT event runs into the thousands, and you won't find a nicer group of people who are always willing to share their experience.

All Leads will present 2 topics/subjects and the Regionals will present a single class. All sessions are repeated twice over the three days of SWAT. The hard task is to select the 8 sessions you wish to see!

Place: Waco Convention Center

<u>Cost</u>: Registration is \$190 for the full three days, (couples can register for \$315). Important Dates:

HCW COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT OPPORTUNITIES!

HCW is starting to get more involved in our community. Here is a list of the programs we're helping and a very brief description of what they do. Please look at each program on our website under the "Community" banner for more information and full details of how to get involved with each one.

EMPTY BOWLS: Organized by the North Texas Food Bank, is an annual event that raises funds to support North Texans facing hunger. The funds raised from the event provide critical support to the NTFB's programs. Bowl contributions may be delivered to *Alain Schwarz*.

<u>VETERANS PENS</u>: Is a diversion program for Justice-Involved Veterans (JIV) who are facing prosecution for one or more criminal cases. Their mission is to provide support and rehabilitation to qualified JIV criminal defendants whose crimes were materially connected to injuries suffered as a result of honorable service in the United States Armed Forces. Completed pens can be given to <u>Lee Craft or Chris Cohen</u>.

FREEDOM PEN: This program started in 2004 by the Sgt Joe Kelly Freedom Pen Foundation as an all-volunteer initiative to provide custom hand-crafted pens to American servicemen and women. It is for anyone interested in donating their time, talent, and services in providing writing instruments for active-duty military personnel, as well as veterans, as a symbol of our support and care. Pens can be delivered to *Lee Craft*.

RESTORED HOPE: This program is dedicated to rescuing young women and their children trapped in sexual slavery, trafficking, and domestic violence. Wood-turned items that are donated from across the region typically bring from \$80 to \$500 each to Restored Hope. Items may be given to *Alain Schwarz*.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD: Is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization. It collects and distributes shoeboxes filled with gifts to children in need around the world. The shoeboxes typically contain toys, school supplies, hygiene items, and other small gifts. It's part of a broader effort to share the gospel and to support communities in crisis. Toys may be delivered to *Ron Williams*.

BEADS OF COURAGE: This program supports children and teens with serious illnesses by helping them tell their stories of bravery through colorful beads. Each bead represents a significant moment in their treatment journey, such as a medical procedure or personal achievement. Boxes may be delivered to Burt Andrew.

HUNT COUNTY FAIR: is an annual event held in Greenville, Texas, focused on the youth, agricultural, educational, economic, cultural, and institutional strengths of the area. HCW supports our community through our participation in the Fair, while offering us the opportunity to show the public what we do. Our demonstrations are popular with fairgoers as we demonstrate the art of woodturning. Our booth is located in front of the Creative Arts building. Finished wood-turned items will be displayed in the booth and within the building.





I pride myself on offering unique, diverse cuts of wood that are not available at any other wood supplier in North Texas.

We spend a lot of time gathering Pecan, Maple, Cedar Elm, Hackberry, Cherry and Red oak logs for Spalting. That's the introduction of a fungus into the wood to add to the natural beauty of the various woods when cut. We also gather pine to be cut into utility projects for the sawmill such as stickers, billets, and forklift pallets. And we cut pine into 1 1/2 inch thick boards by 20-foot lengths for the horse people to build stalls and corrals from. This thick lumber prevents a horse from kicking through their enclosures

OUR MISSION: Hunt County Woodturners, Inc. (a Texas non-profit corporation) also known as Hunt County Woodturners (HCW), is organized exclusively for educational purposes, and its mission is to educate woodturners and the public in and about the art and craft of woodturning. This mission is accomplished by encouraging and facilitating the establishment of training programs for woodturners; by disseminating information about sources of material and equipment; by exposing the art of woodturning to the public; and by serving as a center of information about woodturning for members, galleries, other interested groups, and the general public. Further, the Corporation is organized exclusively for educational purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Financial records are available for inspection upon request.

Hunt County Woodturners, Inc. is recognized by the United States Internal Revenue Service as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization.

Gifts to Hunt County Woodturners, Inc. are fully deductible for U.S. Income Tax purposes.
