#### SWAT News

I just returned from Waco and my first SWAT board meeting of the year. First off, the dates for SWAT this year are August 25, 26, & 27. The set up team will have to be there on Thursday the 24th.

The lead demonstrators this year will be; Emiliano Achaval, Cindy Drozda Colwin Way, Tom Lohman (segmenting), John Lucas, Derik Weidman (off center turning)

Among the regional demonstrators is our own Donna Frazier, Janice Levi (pyrography), Neil Brand, Jim Buckelew (segmenting), Kayla Cooper (pens) and 10 others.

The 3 for 1 Raffle will be giving away a Power Matic Lathe as well as 3 Jet 12/21s The host hotels are the same, the Hilton attached to the convention ctr., and the Courtyard by Marriott across the street from the convention ctr. SWAT rate is \$167.00 per night. Of course, many other hotels available also. Host hotels usually go quick.

Food & Catering, The board spent a long time on this one. As you are aware if you've gone the past couple of years, the food has left a lot to be desired. This is, by far, the largest expense for SWAT costing upwards of \$65,000. They have 26 caterers in Waco to choose from this year, compared to 6 last year, no decision has been made yet. One decision was NOT to have a \$45 Banquet meal this year on Sat. night. There will be a meal, no foo foo meal, just a family style meal, possibly Mexican food or Bar BQ that will cost about \$20 per person. Not \$45. After the meal will be the Sat night Raffle drawing. No meal on Friday night. There will be lunches on Fri, Sat & Sun.

Online Registration will start on March 1st until August 1st. Basic registration will be the same as last year, \$175.00 for all 3 days.

Anyone placing items in the Gallery will be allowed to put out business cards, in a holder if they wish to sell an item. That transaction will be between the seller and the buyer, not involving SWAT.

The rooms could possibly be rearranged to make more larger rooms and eliminate the tiny rooms. This may possibly effect HCW's longtime location, not sure yet. That is about all for now. I'll let you know more when I know. Thanks, Lee

## HCW Tips of the month!

How to Remove Paint from Wood Without Chemicals -Woodturning Tips

#### How to Remove Paint from Wood Without Chemicals

Stripping or removing paint from any surface, be it wood, metal, or plastic is seldom an easy task. It is a difficult task because every surface or item takes paint differently, meaning that you will need to implore unique steps to remove it depending on the type of material it is on.

Both professionals and amateurs trying to remove paint from wood and other items or surfaces have had to settle for chemical-based removers or strippers. Albeit effective, these chemical-based strippers are made with toxic materials which not only makes them harmful to you but also makes it harmful to our environment at large.

#### Manual Paint Removal Method

Although scraping the paint away may seem like the best paint removal, there are certain toxic chemicals found in the debris that are capable of damaging certain parts of your body. If you opt for the manual paint removal method, there are certain steps you need to take to get the job done safely.

#### **Baking Soda and Boiling Water**

If your small wooden furniture is plastered with paint, baking soda and boiling water could be the perfect way to remove paint from them. Do not get your hopes high though, as good as this sounds, it is quite tricky to get done. Before you get started on this, there are a couple of essential materials or items you'd need to have at hand. They are: paper towels, water, baking soda, tongs, large pans, a flexible scraper, and a stiff-bristled brush.



#### Hunt County Woodturners Board Meeting Minutes June 1, 2023

The meeting was held at Wesley United Methodist Church and was also open to members through Zoom, conducted by Sully Sullivan. Jim Stewart attended the Zoom session.

**Club members Attending in Person:** Lee Craft\*, Alain Schwarz\*, Sully Sullivan\*, Doug Balzer\*, Burt Andrew\*, Cynthia Balzer, Mark Spencer\*, Cheryl Sanders, Gary Sanders.

Board Members absent: Rod Brumlow.

[Voting board members for 2023 indicated \*. A quorum of board members was in attendance.]

The Meeting was called to order at 6:08pm with HCW President, Lee Craft, presiding.

#### Items of Business

- Board Meeting minutes from May 4, 2023:

Alain Schwarz made a motion to accept the minutes from the May 4, 2023, board meeting with no changes. The motion was seconded by Sully Sullivan. Motion passed.

- Misc. Items of Interest
  - Membership stands at 99. Ed and Janice Drake from Farmersville are our newest members.
  - The June meeting will be our last opportunity to order HCW logo items. Burt will email the order forms to members once more before next week's meeting. Forms will also be available at the meeting. The schedule:
    - June meeting Final date that order forms and payments may be turned in.
    - July Vendor processing time.
    - August meeting Delivery of apparel to members in time for SWAT (late August).
  - Lee requested distribution of an updated membership listing.
  - Discussed reserving the church's banquet room early for our Christmas party. Lee will take steps to reserve the date. First choice, Friday, December 8. Second choice, Friday, December 15.
- Club Leadership
  - With the recent resignation of Treasurer Alan Fields, co-treasurer Mark Spencer has agreed to fill the primary position.

Burt Andrew made a motion to approve Mark Spencer as Treasurer. The motion was seconded by Alain Schwarz. Motion passed.

- $\circ$   $\;$  This change will be announced at the June Club meeting.
- Mark has already been authorized to access the Club's Alliance Bank accounts (ref. Minutes from April 4, 2023). Following Alan's resignation from his elected Board position, his name will be removed as a signatory on the Alliance accounts.

Doug Balzer made a motion to remove Alan Fields as signatory on the Alliance Bank accounts. The motion was seconded by Alain Schwarz. Motion passed.

- Mark will follow through with Alliance Bank to make this change.
- Sully announced that his new job will require travel and that he may not be able to continue in his role as Technology Coordinator. TBD.
- Had a brief discussion regarding other elected positions for next year, particularly President. This important position needs early consideration since a new candidate may need time to prepare. Lee will address this subject at an upcoming club meeting.

#### - Upcoming Club Demonstrations and Open Shops

- Johnny Hayre will demonstrate the making of an epoxy embellished vase during the June meeting.
- Burt Andrew (8085 CR 2578, Royse City, TX) will host Open Shop and will show how to make inexpensive/custom lathe tools, traditional and carbide, during the mini-class.
- No demo is currently scheduled for July. Alain indicated that he may check with Kevin Bassett, Cory White, or others. Donna Frazier will host July's Open Shop.
- Tom Nehl is lined up for the August demo.

#### Women in Turning (Cynthia Balzer)

- The next WIT is scheduled for June 17, 8am to 4pm, Lee Craft's shop. The candlestick project will be continued. Donna Frazier will be the instructor.
- A following WIT event is tentatively being scheduled for July 8. The program being considered is bracelets and pendants.
- Cynthia reported that the Penny Raffle is on track with \$590 collected so far.

#### - Training:

- Lee will contact Training Coordinator Rod Brumlow to discuss possible subjects and dates for future training events. Subjects previously discussed for these two-day classes align with interests expressed by club members in the survey completed early this year. Possibilities include:
  - Segmenting (Rod Brumlow, Dale King, Dale Scruggs)
  - Wood carving (Stacy Nehl)
  - Embellishments (Cory White)

#### Quarterly Challenge

- Our Quarterly Challenge, due June meeting, will be the turning of a goblet, mug, or drinking vessel.
- The winner, as selected by attending members, will receive a \$50 gift card from Rockler, Woodworld, or Woodcraft.

• At Lee's request, Alain will pick up gift cards from Woodworld and Woodcraft (\$20; \$50) for future use.

#### Bois D'Ark Bash (September 22/23, 2023)

- This event is held annually on the 4<sup>th</sup> weekend of September. HCW has for several years hosted a booth on the Saturday of the event. The decision was made not to participate this year, after considering the Club's return on effort and time expended. Factors considered:
  - Very poor club participation last year.
  - Low event attendance, especially during Saturday afternoon. Last year the area was nearly vacant from noon through the rest of the day.
  - This one-day event has not resulted in new members.
  - The Club's assigned location (near electricity) is increasingly out of the flow of traffic and is typically uncomfortable for demonstrators for much of the event (direct sun, high heat).
- As a more productive approach toward publicizing Club activities, Gary suggested another demo day at the Greenville Public Library. He will contact the library to check out future possibilities.

#### - SWAT (Lee Craft)

 The Board developed and discussed a list of several possible recipients for the 2023 SWAT scholarship (free registration). Selection TBD.

#### - Financial (Mark Spencer)

- Mark presented a refined 2023 Budget Summary through May; source documents included the check register and available receipts. More work is to be done.
  - He is adding line items to provide additional details as needed.
  - Several income and expense items have yet to be identified and moved to the correct income/ expense categories. A discussion during the meeting resulted in the identification and categorization of some of them.
  - Will consider adding a line item for special demonstrators (one or two demonstrations per year).
  - Discussed the high/increasing cost of the storage building. Mark will research other storage building options in the area.
  - Mark will check out and report on options and costs of using credit cards at club events, as well as sending out Paypal invoices on request.
  - Discussed the relatively high \$14.5K checking account balance at Alliance and the current rate of CD's.



Sully Sullivan made a motion for Mark to move \$10K of the checking account balance to a 7 month CD offered by Alliance with 5% interest. Doug Balzer seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 8:00pm.
